
Learning how to read is such a huge step. Where do you start?

How did Mrs. Molly learn how to read? Dick and Jane!!! These are the perfect books to begin your child's journey!


BOB Books:



Another great series and we have all the beginner sets! Just like Dick and Jane you begin with one word per page and then slowly build up to full sentences!


Biff, Chip & Kipper:

This series has four letters or levels A, B, C, and D. Begin with letter A. This set is great for kids who are animal lovers!




Leapfrog Books:



These books under ER LEA in our early reader section are great when it comes to introducing certain vowel sounds to kids. For example: short vowels, short I, short a, short u


Board Books:

For this next step, check out the books that say that they are **Level 1** in the early reader section (ER). Not all are created equal, but this is still a good rule to start with!








Hello Reader! Level 1
